As I write this, Long Island is just getting over a snow storm. So it's with hope and much joy that I write for the <u>Spring</u> 2014 "... from the heart."

Now, I know we need Winter. There can't be a Spring without a Winter. In the Winter everything dies, in the Spring everything comes back to life again. There can't be new life without there first being a death. By faith we know that Spring WILL come: believe it and rejoice!

It is also with hope and much joy that I write about Easter, or as I prefer, Resurrection Day. It comes late this year, April 20th, the later the better, because to me that means the later the warmer. It is significant that the day we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead comes during Spring-time; life coming forth out of death. There had to be a death in order for there to be a resurrection.

The resurrection is our key to understanding Jesus.

"He was shown to be the Son of God when he was raised from the dead." Romans 1:4 NLT

Two things, (1) Jesus is shown to be the Son of God by the resurrection and (2) God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ is a God who raises the dead.

This is really good news.

"It's news I'm most proud to proclaim, this extraordinary Message of God's powerful plan to rescue everyone who trusts him." Romans 1:16 (from THE MESSAGE)

God rescues everyone who trusts in His Son. Jesus died to give us eternal life, but Jesus also gives life now. Jesus died for sin so we could die to sin, and Jesus was raised from the dead so we could live in newness of life.

"Just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives." Romans 6:4 NLT

Like Spring setting the earth free from the death of Winter, we are set free from sin (death) in order to live newness of life: Let me make clear that we are not free from the possibility of sin, but from the compulsion to sin. "Could it be any clearer? Our old way of life was nailed to the Cross with Christ, a decisive end to that sin-miserable life — no longer at sin's every beck and call! What we believe is this: If we get included in Christ's sinconquering death, we also get included in his life-saving resurrection." Romans 6:6-8 (from THE MESSAGE)

When we accept Jesus - His death for our sins and the power of His resurrection - our old, miserable sinful way of living dies with Him on the cross, and we have resurrected life. We put to death old ways, and live God's way.

We die only to those things which are always already passing away, and we are becoming increasingly alive to those spiritual realities which will live on forever. As someone has said, "He is no fool who surrenders what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose!"

Every Spring, God is rewriting the story of death to life. Every Easter we are reminded that Jesus has rewritten the story of death to life. Do you know that Jesus can also rewrite your story – from death to life? Believe it and rejoice!

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
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The Power of Prayer

One of the greatest privileges we have is prayer: Constant access to the great Creator of all things. We may not understand the circumstances He puts us in sometimes, but times of sorrow or crisis bring us to our knees before Him; times of joy and thanksgiving should have the same effect. This is the story of my cousin, now affectionately known as "Miracle Mike."



On March 2, 2013, my cousin Danielle (Mike's sister in law) was married. Mike danced all night long with his beautiful wife, Lori, and their three adorable daughters, Emily, Cait, and Julie. This picture was taken that night. Little did they know that their lives would be forever changed the next day. At a celebratory breakfast at a hotel with the family, Mike suddenly collapsed; he hit his head on the marble floor and was knocked completely unconscious. Even amid his family and friends, there was no one there to catch him before he fell. An ambulance rushed Mike, still unconscious several minutes later, and Lori to the hospital, my mother took the girls, and everyone was panicked. It was determined that he had suffered a severe skull fracture. He slipped into a coma, and despite many operations and precautionary measures, he

wasn't improving. Days went by, then a week, and still, no major advances had been made. One moment he would seem to be improving, the next he was declining. I reached out to all of you for your prayers; I knew I could depend on my Forever Family to support us, even if you had never met me or my family. His situation became more dismal by the day, and the doctors started to prepare us all for his passing. Even if he did miraculously wake up, he would be severely brain damaged and would probably never have a normal life again. It was doubtful that he would ever walk or talk again. This man, this devoted father, husband and friend, may never be the same — how could this be happening? The agony and despair was almost unbearable; we all knelt before our Lord in prayer. His doctors and nurses prayed for him. This church, and many other churches, prayed for him.

Almost two weeks after the fall, with our hope waning, his eyes finally opened. His hands moved, gesturing toward Lori. His legs twitched — he was trying to get up. He was responding; against all odds, with no scientific explanation at all, he was alive, he was not paralyzed, and many lives, not just his, were restored. Every day he made incredible strides, and his progress absolutely baffled his doctors. Not only could he talk, he was out of bed and walking within 5 days. Mike, who was never supposed to open his eyes again, was alive and well on his road to recovery. After he awoke, he was projected to be in the hospital for a month — he was in a rehabilitation facility in less than 2 weeks. He should have been in this center for 1-2 months; he was out in another 2 weeks. He not only met all of his goals, he crushed them. He exceeded every expectation and continued to amaze every person that came in contact with him. There was no denying that God had a hand in his recovery. There was, and still is, no other logical explanation.

Now, I year later, he is fully recovered, able to return to full duty as a New York City firefighter, and his previously weak vision has returned to 20/20. He retained all of his memories of Danielle's wedding, and his entire life before that night. He cannot tell you what happened when he was in a coma, or what happened for the next month and a half, but he can tell you everything that has happened to him has been nothing short of a miracle. together as a patchwork to form full size blankets. It takes 49 blocks to make a full size blanket and we did it! We have created our own full sized blanket, ready for donation! Our group is open to old and young, experienced and "newbies." You can work on your own stitching projects as well as get involved in some of our outreach projects. We share a few relaxing hours of stitchery, fellowship, and laughs together. We meet every third Thursday of the month in the Youth Center next door to the church. What is it about Valentine's Day that compels us to order dozens of roses, send boxes of chocolates, seek cards that express the perfect sentiment or pass out little heart shaped candies stamped, "Be Mine!" Silly as all that might sound, imagine what would happen if you failed to deliver one of those traditional expressions of love to that someone special this Valentine's Day. The funny thing is that when most people are asked what they know about Valentine's Day, it generally isn't much. A few will tell about some guy called St. Valentine, but most spout off about Cupid's arrows or some other nonsense. Valentine's Day is not an official holiday, but is probably renowned as much, or more, than every other holiday except Christmas. Yet most people know more about Ground Hog Day than Valentine's Day. Why is that? Perhaps one reason is that there are as many as seven different versions of the story, and seven different men named Valentine. This is the account that is most

Valentine was a bishop who was imprisoned for his faith by Emperor Claudius II. After a year in prison, the children who greatly missed him began to toss loving notes and flowers between the bars of his cell window. At times, Valentine's jailer's blind daughter, Julia, brought to him notes and flowers from the children. Valentine fell in love with Julia and prayed that she would regain her sight. Before his death, Valentine wrote a farewell note to Julia and signed it "From Your Valentine". His sentence was carried out on February 14th 270 AD.

Valentine's Day connects the heart to the power of love! There is no magic potion as powerful as true love. There is nothing like falling head over heels in love. The search for and struggle that leads to true love is so compelling to the heart that it's been the premise of thousands of movies, and the groundwork for countless novels. No matter how young or old we are, we are entranced by a story in which true love stands up against the forces that threaten to pull it apart. True love can overcome crucibles of sickness, isolation, money,

misunderstandings, exhaustion and jealousy. And yet, in real life we somehow manage to injure the very people we love the most, because our love is imperfect and we grapple with our own insecurities.

I listened to the cry of a person who was suffering the pain of rejection. "*If people really knew what I was like, they wouldn't like me.*" What heart ache. If we could only see ourselves the way God sees us. It's an incredible thing to realize that God thoroughly knew us before we were even conceived, and still loved us. "I knew you before I formed you in your

mother's womb. Before you were born I set you apart..." (Jeremiah 1:5 *NLT*)

God lovingly designed a path and plan for our lives; he patiently waits for us to seek his guidance and counsel to discover it. "For I know the plans I have for you," says the LORD. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope." (Jeremiah 29"11 NLT)

The story of true love is the story of sacrifice. Unless there is a price to pay, a battle to be won, or an enemy to defeat, there cannot be true love. The essence of love is giving not taking. "Love is patient and kind ... not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable... keeps no record of being wronged. It does not rejoice about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance." (1 Corinthians 13: 4-7 NLT)

It's true that some of us have a greater capacity for love than others, but all of us have been given the chance to experience true and perfect love. It isn't natural to us, but it is to God. The story of perfect love was written in blood and nailed to a rough splintery cross over 2,000 years ago, when God, our heavenly father, made the ultimate sacrifice for us, giving his only son to die in our place ... undeserved, unmerited, Love of God. It's the greatest love story ever told, but it doesn't end there. Perfect love is a living thing; we can experience it daily, hourly even moment by moment. The more we open our heart to experience His perfect love, the greater our capacity to love and be loved by others. Think of how that kind of love could make your next Valentine's Bay the best ever.
