Play for Peace

August 9 will be the 5th annual Play for Peace soccer tournament. From the first tournament in 2009 our teens (and some adults too) have served as the volunteers for this event. The idea for the tournament came in response to the killing of Marcelo Lucero on November 8, 2008. The purpose of the tournament was to bring together soccer teams of different ethnic backgrounds to unite the community and denounce racist acts. At the time I was serving on the "Unity Coalition" which was formed to address the problem of racism in our community. Through that I was asked by the Suffolk County Legislator to be a part of the tournament's planning committee.

At the very first Play for Peace our teens made such an impression that the second year one of the organizers refused to be involved unless our teen volunteers came back, saying, "they are the best volunteers I've ever worked with!"

Again this year our teens, and some adults too, will be the volunteers for Play for Peace. In the morning we need some tents, and pop-ups set up, as well as preparing coolers of water. Toward the end of the event ,we will serve food to the players and workers, take down the tents, and clean up. If you would like to help please let me know. Also contact me if you know of a team (male or female) that would like to play, or if you would like to sponsor a team (or know someone who would).

If you would like to attend the event it begins at 9:30am with an opening ceremony. I will say a prayer as part of the opening ceremony. The first game begins at 10am. It will be held at the Pat/Med Youth Soccer Fields located on Sipp Avenue (north of Woodside Avenue).

As I said, it will be a busy summer. Of course we will still be meeting every Sunday at 10am to worship our God and there will be Bible classes for children through teens.

In March, Jim went to be with the Lord. I miss him very much. Jim was our Church Treasurer, a Church Board member, Director of the Men's Ministry, and a good friend and Christian Brother.

Jim came to our church with Barbara and became a member of the Church of the Nazarene in October of 2002. I officiated at his wedding to Barbara on October 25, 2006.

He was a member of AA and was sober for 27 years. He always said that AA helped him get right with people, and our church helped him get right with God. Through AA, he sponsored and helped hundreds of people. In our church, he touched many lives as well.

After his AA meetings, he would usually stop by my office to chat. Sometimes he had a question we would discuss. Many times he would want my opinion on something he may have heard, or was thinking about, or was going through in his life at the time. We would discuss the Bible or a Biblical passage. He had great stories and was great at telling them, so I always loved his stories. I loved those times together, I looked forward to them, and I really miss those times.

Before retiring, Jim was a Federal Treasury Agent, then a Special Investigator for the Suffolk County DA's office – investigating racketeering cases. Though the cop in him tried to keep a tough exterior demeanor, I / we saw an emotional side of Jim, especially at our Men's Encouragement Network (M.E.N.) meetings on Monday nights. He was a caring, kindhearted, and compassionate man. He helped and made a difference in the lives of many people; he did it with humility and without looking for recognition.

Do you know what a "foxhole" is? It's a shallow hole dug by a soldier in combat for refuge against enemy fire. Often people are asked who they would want next to them in a foxhole. Jim was the kind of person you would want with you in a fox hole. At least he is who I would want with me.

I am so thankful that we are brothers in Christ, and because of that, I will see my brother Jim again in heaven, but until then I really miss him. – PJ

A Day of Honor

June is upon us, and 2014 is half way behind us ... where did the time go? June marks a seasonal changing of the guard, with warm weather weddings a plenty. June hosts a plethora of

commemorative holidays including: D Day, Flag Day, the summer solstice and my personal favorite, FATHER'S DAY. Even though Father's Day seems like it's been around forever, it's a relative newcomer to the calendar. A Father's Day Proclamation was signed by President Nixon in 1972 - 58 years after Mother's Day. During the 1920s and 1930s, annual rallies were held in New York City's Central Park with designs on scrapping Mother's Day and replacing it with, "Parent's Day." The reasoning was that both Mothers and Fathers should be honored together. The Great Depression derailed that effort, as struggling businesses pushed for a Father's Day holiday, to create demand for neckties, hats, socks, pipes and golf clubs.

Commercialism aside, the 4th Commandment makes it crystal clear, "Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving you." Exodus 20:12 Father's Day took a long time to come about, and though its passage into law might not have had the purest of motives, it was the right thing to do. Isn't that the way this life often is? There are times you want something so badly, you can almost taste it! You ache for it to happen. It might not be for you but for someone you care about. Your purpose is unselfish; your prayers are true, your heart dedicated to the proposition of bringing the thing about. Not wanting to leave personal effort out, you do everything you can think of, but after trying to move heaven and earth, it still doesn't happen.

Abraham, the Old Testament Patriarch and spiritual father of both Jews and Gentiles, wasn't always so highly regarded. For most of his life, Abraham wasn't the father of anyone. He was Abram, a successful businessman, a wealthy landowner, loved by his wife Sari. But the couple had a problem, no children. Without offspring, Abram saw his life as an empty dead end. He had no heir to pass on his wealth, or share his wisdom or life's experiences. He would not live on through a son or daughter. God knew Abram and Sari's greatest desire, and early on in life, made a

covenant with Abram promising him an inheritance of land and children. *Then the LORD took Abram outside and said to him, "Look up into the sky and count the stars if you can. That's how many descendants you will have!*" Gen 15:5 NLT

Though God swore it was a done deal, the child of promise was delayed; Abram and Sari didn't have offspring like the sand on the sea shore, they had no children at all! Sari remained barren, unable to bear children. At the age of one hundred, everything changed, including their names; the impossible occurred, and Sarah named her only son Isaac, which means Laughter.

How long has it been since you had an unreserved, no holds barred, belly laugh? How long have you been carrying the weight of the world on your shoulders, with the thought, this is just the way my life is now. Abundant life and the joy of the Lord seem like distant memories, as you trudge through your daily existence. Like The Natural's Roy Hobbs, life didn't work out the way you expected ... not the way you believed it would. Or even worse, you were convinced that God gave you a promise a while back, maybe years ago, but it never happened.

Father's Day is more than just a day of honor. For Christians, it is also a reminder that even though hopes and dreams might be delayed, they're never late in God's time frame. "For the vision is yet for an appointed time ... though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come, it will not tarry. " Hab 2:3 (NLT) Father's Day is a time for revisiting memories, for looking back and reminding ourselves of where we are and what God has brought us through. It can also be a moment of epiphany, when the past and present come together as you realize that you didn't get to this point of your life alone: God's faithfulness brought you here. Since He has proven Himself trustworthy in the past, you know you can depend on Him for the present and future. That's what the Joy of the Lord is my strength, means! So this Father's Day, enjoy a deep cleansing breath and know that your Heavenly Father wants to enjoy the day with you.
